



Liz Delaney is Borrego’s Senior Director of Wholesale Market Development. Liz leads Borrego’s utility-scale policy and business development team, which focuses on identifying strategic opportunities for solar and storage deployment and advocates for improvements in energy policies nationwide. Liz also represents Borrego at NEPOOL, focusing on both utility-scale and distributed generation-related topics, and oversees the company’s engagement with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). Before joining Borrego, Liz was a policy advocate, representing Environmental Defense Fund at NEPOOL, where she also served as the 2019 End User Sector Vice-Chair. Liz has also worked for Harvard University, Earthwatch Institute, and the Eastern Research Group on a variety of initiatives advancing energy efficiency, renewable energy, economic policy, and climate science. Liz received her undergraduate degree from Boston College, her masters from George Washington University, and holds a certificate in energy innovation from Stanford University.

Borrego develops, designs, builds, and maintains distributed and utility-scale solar photovoltaic and battery storage systems for utilities, independent power producers, and other renewable asset portfolio owners. Borrego has installed over 700 solar projects and nearly 50 solar plus storage or standalone energy storage projects and has over 8 GW of solar and 6 GW of storage in its development pipeline. While historically focused on the California, New York, and New England markets, Borrego recently expanded its operations in the Midwest, Southwest, and Mid-Atlantic regions.
